Within our school this support has allowed us to organise and coordinate the best possible programs outside of the traditional teaching and learning classroom structure. This includes and is not limited to:


- the purchasing of Art, Physical Education, STEM and AUSLAN equipment and resources, which in turn, supports them to be exemplary programs.

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

Financial Support for Families



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Transfers & Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information.

If a family is exiting the school, within two weeks of their departure, the balance of their account (if in credit) will be either, transferred to their new school, transferred to a bank account of their choice (please submit a request, complete with bank account details to thornhill.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au, alternatively call the school directly to arrange reimbursement). Any remaining CSEF will be transferred to their new school.

FRFF INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Financial contributions for curriculum items and activities, which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
